

Synopsis of Raymond J Classen Memorial Airport (8is5) Operational Rules

The procedures to be used at the Raymond J Classen Memorial Airport (8is5) are those procedures set forth in the Federal Aviation Regulations for operation at any small airport. If there is any conflict between the FARs and any current or future procedures established at the Raymond J Classen Memorial Airport (8is5), the federal regulations obviously take precedence.

Guests must return a signed statement stating that they have read and understand and agree to be bound by the Raymond J Classen Memorial Airport (8is5) Operating Rules. This information will be logged by the Operations Manager in advance of the Guest's arrival and will be a matter of record. Guests are responsible for tying down their airplanes in a safe location. No aircraft shall be parked on the landing strip or any taxi-way.

Guests are not allowed to perform aircraft operations that include activities involving passengers for hire, sightseeing or any other passenger activity unless explicit permission is granted by the airport manager.

All users shall personally inspect the runway before each use and determine for themselves if the runway condition is safe for the type of airplane involved to land or take off. **Each user and anyone accompanying a user of the airport ASSUMES ALL RISKS inherent in landing or taking off at such an unattended facility.**

Raymond J Classen Memorial Airport landing procedure is to use Right hand traffic when landing to the South and Left hand traffic landing to the North. This is not mandatory, but is a good practice to avoid the nearby village of Danforth.

It is always the Pilot in Command's responsibility to determine if runway and flight conditions are safe for the intended use and to take appropriate action to avoid unsafe conditions. All radio equipped aircraft shall monitor 123.0 for instrument traffic into Kankakee, IL (IKK).
